Palestine Film Industry Finds Solidarity at Marché du Film

nternational support for the people of Gaza has not gone unnoticed by them in the ongoing war in the Middle East that has so far claimed thousands of lives. In gratitude to student protests that have taken over campuses worldwide,

Gazans have responded by scrawling thank you notes in the sand and on makeshift tents and posting them online

Not that it can save anyone from the horror of the relentless killings, the abductions of medics, child amputations without anesthetics, the effects of enforced starvation, the loss of loved ones or the 100-plus reporters to have died in the conflict, but it might just give the people of Gaza a glimmer of something to know the they are represented here in Cannes. As the Palestine Film Institute (PFI) puts it: "Amidst the ongoing war on the Palestinian identity and its narrative, the Palestine Film Institute (PFI) emphasises the importance of supporting Palestinian films and narratives in international forums."

In collaboration with Cannes Docs 2024, the PFI is presenting for the seventh year running four docs in progress, as part of the Marché's Palestine Showcase.

THE FOUR PROJECTS ARE:

My Father's House (Palestine, Denmark) from director Mahdi Fleifel of Nakba FilmWorks. Produced by Geoff Arbourne (Inside Out Films, UK) the film begins nine years after his father's death, when Fleifel returns from years of exile to Elsinore in Denmark.

Palestine Comedy Club is the debut feature from the photographer Alaa Aaliabdallah (Regash), and is produced by Charlotte Knowles (Tough Crowd, UK). The story follows five Palestinian stand-up comedians who write and tour a stand-up comedy show exploring the complexity of Palestinian identity. The countries of production are Palestine and the UK. *The Myth of Mahmoud* is directed by Mayar Hamdan and Shaima Al-Tamimi who also produces. In the film, Hamdan captures the lives of her Palestinian family, who have resided in Doha for over 60 years.

Unmaking Of by Bilal Alkhatib is set less than two weeks before shooting a movie by Cherien Dabis in the West Bank, when the war breaks out in Gaza. In reality, filming on the Palestinian-American filmmaker Dabis's feature *All That's Left Of You* was aborted in Jaffa and completed filming in Cyprus instead once the conflict began.

The Palestine Showcase will be held on May 19, between 10.00-11.15 at the Lerins 4, Riviera.

The sole film with a Palestinian narrative playing in the official selection of the festival is *The Belle from Gaza*. The documentary by French filmmaker Yolande Zauberman, follows a group of Palestinians fleeing Gaza for Tel Aviv.

In reality in the current conflict, no one can escape Gaza without a foreign passport, unless they pay huge baksheesh to Egypt for an Egyptian visa, because the Rafah border is closed — reportedly a war crime. And, *To a Land Unknown* by Mahdi Fleifel is screening at the Directors Fortnight. The film tells the story of two Palestinian cousins who flee a refugee camp in Lebanon, hoping to reach Germany.

Tamara Mariam Dawit is an **Ethiopian-Canadian filmmaker** and policy advisor in the creative sector. Among her best-known films is the awardwinning 2020 documentary Finding Sally – about her aunt, an Ethiopian aristocrat-turnedcommunist-rebel who disappeared after the Ethiopian revolution. She is an alumnus of Berlinale Talents, Durban Talents, Doha Producers Lab, Rotterdam Lab, Apost and EAVE. In 2021 she was named a TIFF/ Netflix producing fellow.

You are moderating the EAVE session on Best Practices for Equitable Productions, that will present the key findings of the EAVE Impact Think Tank report. What can we expect from the session?

The report underscores numerous barriers, but a significant overarching issue is the need to update and rethink policies governing producer collaborations. Many of these policies stem from outdated, Eurocentric systems, limiting equal opportunities for producers from lowercapacity countries and marginalised communities. We must evaluate if these policies are future-proof, relevant in today's global landscape, and align with a more humanist values approach to collaboration. Our session features producers who participated in the Think Tank, discussing their recommendations and sharing real-life examples. Attendees will gain actionable insights to integrate into their co-production workflows, fostering a more inclusive industry.

Why are we not where you would really like to be where issues of equality and inclusion in the industry are concerned? Real progress within the screen sector in these

areas is frequently hindered by a tendency to prioritise superficial actions over meaningful change. Despite ample discussion, there's a notable lack of concrete policy changes and sustained efforts. This is why our industry is still plagued by issues of systemic racism, gender bias etc. Change only happens when those in positions of power recognise their privilege and actively contribute to fostering inclusivity within the industry. This is why our panel is focused on sharing actionable recommendations for producers, aiming to transform how they collaborate with their peers globally, including those in Eastern Europe, Africa, Indigenous communities and beyond.

This is a very productive period for you, with Alazar in Cannes and Made in Ethiopia at Tribeca, and a slate of films in development. What drives your output? While releasing films is indeed a significant

achievement, it's important to acknowledge that challenges persist for producers. In my view, filmmaking is a team sport, and it's through our collaborations that we're able to consistently deliver high-quality content, even amidst the fluctuations and instability in our industry. For my company, our primary aim is to create opportunities for African stories, creators and characters to share their voices through cinema. Projects like Alazar and Made in Ethiopia exemplify this dedication, offering audiences a glimpse into the lives of Ethiopians through contemporary storytelling. That's why my content pipeline remains closely focused on both the storytellers' positionality and delivering compelling narratives.

Describe your role with EAVE. How does it dovetail with your filmmaking work?

My consulting work with EAVE is a mix of training for programmes like Access, which is for BIPOC producers in Canada, and policy initiatives like the EAVE Impact Think Tanks. Both aspects of this work reflect my dedication to improving our industry and supporting a resilient generation of producers, especially those from marginalised backgrounds. This commitment stems from the support and mentorship I received earlier in my career, which significantly strengthened my own journey.

What are your plans – and your hopes – for Cannes this year?

I'm eager to engage with industry stakeholders and producers about the recommendations in EAVE's latest report, as well as to screen our new film, *Alazar*. Amidst the busy schedule, I'm also looking forward to some peaceful moments on the beach and reconnecting with peers over meals. JULIAN NEWBY

TCCF 2024: Over \$3 million investment for new content

he Taiwan Creative Content Agency (TAICCA) has set the dates for the fifth Taiwan Creative Content Fest (TCCF), which will take place from November 5-8, at the Taipei Nangang Exhibition Center. The organisation is drawing attention in Cannes to the Project to Screen section which is opening for international submissions shortly. The section includes four categories - feature films, series, animation and documentaries. Submissions open on June 3, and will undergo evaluation by a panel of international juries. Selected entries will receive training resources and present proposals during TCCF, with accommodation subsidies offered. One outstanding project will be awarded the Project to Screen: Best Project award and a prize of US\$30,000. All selected projects can apply for TAIC-CA's Creative Content Development Program (CCDP) - Development Fund and Taiwan's International Co-funding Program 2.0 (TICP 2.0) Option 2 within two years. Aside from projects selected from the TCCF Project to Screen open call, ones from the TAICCA workshop in collaboration with Festival des 3 Continents/Produire au Sud, Series Mania Institute and audiovisual professionals from South Korea, will also be presented in pitching sessions.

Another section of TCCF Pitching, Story to Screen, recommends story IPs with adaptation potential, including fiction and non-fiction, comics and original story concepts. Along with Shoot the Book! TCCF session — a collaboration with SCELF — Story to Screen will present Taiwanese and French stories with marketability to domestic and international buyers and professionals, aiming to facilitate adaptations, foster collaborations and expand the reach of compelling narratives.

To further support the cultural investment environment, that was made favourable following the amendment regarding the Development of the Cultural and Creative Industries Act, TAICCA has collaborated with leading domestic telecommunication and technology companies, including ASUS and ADATA, as well as international creative content companies, including CJ ENM Hong Kong and Warner Bros. Discovery Group, to establish funds, laying the groundwork for producing high-quality works with global appeal.

Asian hitmakers team on top-secret drama series

roducer Akira Morii and director J.Q. Lee have announced their collaboration on a new drama series for the global market. Morii is from Tokyo-based production company The Seven, a subsidiary of Tokyo Broadcasting System

Holdings; Lee is Film Monster, a Korean label under SLL.

Currently in development, the action-packed drama series came out of a partnership that developed after Lee approached Morii, aware of a number of his global successes developed in Japan, notably the Netflix hit *Alice in Borderland*.

Lee has been involved in hit films and series from Korea including the drama *All of Us Are Dead*, that topped the Netflix charts for two weeks in 91 countries.

The pair haven't disclosed details of the new series, except that its protagonist has "unique abilities never-before-seen in movies or Japanese comics, promising an unprecedented viewing experience". Morii added: "I can say that this project will feature an ingenious and unheard-of storyline." Lee first approached Morii with the idea, which he "passionately embraced and added innovative ideas, resulting in a more compelling story", Lee said. "I believe that by working together, we can create a piece that resonates with people worldwide, not only in Korea and Japan. Although Morii plays on a global stage, he possesses a meticulous sensibility that is unique to the Japanese." Morii added: "As a big fan of Lee's work, I was pleasantly surprised and delighted when he approached me with a proposal."

The Seven has signed a memorandum of understanding for the co-production of films and drama series with SLL Japan, the Japanese subsidiary of SLL established in 2022. SLL is a Korean production studio that has produced a number of hits including *Itaewon Class*, which was remade for the Japanese audience.

SANDRINE BONNAIRE TO DIRECT SLOW JOE

The Singapore-based film production and distribution company, Hazelnut Media (formerly Darpan Global) has brought acclaimed director Sandrine Bonnaire (Elle s'appelle Sabine, J'enrage de son absence) on board to spearhead its upcoming biopic Slow Joe. The English-, French- and Konkani-language feature film will begin principal photography in India and France in early 2025. Slow Joe tells the true story of the late Indian musician Joseph Manuel Da Rocha — "Slow Joe" — chronicling his journey from Goa to international acclaim in France, overcoming a troubled past through music. A chance encounter on the beaches of Goa changed his life forever. French music producers saw Joe's potential, leading to a career based out of Lyon, after a triumphant performance at the 2009 Transmusicales festival in Rennes. He had an innate musical talent and a rare crooner voice. The story is a testament to hope, redemption and the uniting power of music. Hazelnut Media is hosting a photocall with Sandrine Bonnaire and the film's team in celebration of Slow Joe on May 18, at 14.00, at the Singapore Pavilion.

MARCHÉ DU FILM BREAKS RECORDS

As the Marché du Film – Festival de Cannes opened its doors in Cannes yesterday, the Marché du Film organisers anticipate setting a new historic record this year. With on-site registration still ongoing, the 2024 market edition is expected to welcome over 15,000 accredited participants from more than 140 countries, surpassing last year's record high of 14,000 on-site participants. Al fuelled the Hollywood strikes but it is helping the industry too

he shock to the industry caused by the SAG-AFTRA and WGA strikes in 2023 can still be felt, with many projects still only just back up and running. Fears of a lack of available content for 2024 and beyond were real — but it's an industry that always bounces back, and that's exactly what it is doing.

One of the elements that triggered the strikes that won't go away, however, was artificial intelligence — AI — and the fear that it would take jobs from writers, actors and many other sectors within the industry.

But the fact is that the industry has been using AI for some years now and so far, we haven't seen a virtual Tom Cruise jumping buildings on the big screen, nor have we heard an AI script attempting to mimic the inimitable styles of Aaron Sorkin or Arthur Harari.

It was back in 2020 that Cinelytic Inc. announced that Warner Bros. Pictures International (WBPI) had signed on to use the company's AI-driven project management system that was launched for the film industry in 2019. At that stage WBPI's aim was to use Cinelytic to inform decision-making around content and talent, in order to support its release strategies.

Several years before then 20th Century Fox began working with partners including Google Cloud to better understand moviegoer choices and identify patterns in audiences' preferences for different types of film. 20th Century Fox has also developed the Merlin Video neural network to predict the success of promo videos and trailers. The same company also employed the IBM Watson program to create and edit a trailer for its sci-fi movie Morgan back in 2016. From the 90-minute movie, the AI system delivered six minutes of trailer footage, the entire process taking about 24 hours — a job that would otherwise have taken weeks. Thought to be the first to be generated entirely by AI, The Frost: Part One is a

The Frost: Part One. The first all-Al film? 12-minute film in which every shot is generated by image-making AI tool DALL-E 2. Based on a script written by an actual human — Josh Rubin — the film used another AI tool, D-ID, to animate still images. The film was made last year by Detroit-based video creation company Waymark.

And companies invoved in the creation and application of AI are present once again in Cannes. The Cannes Next 2024 focus on AI is in partnership with Microsoft at the company's A.I.Cafe on the beach. The cafe is hosting hands-on demos, filmmaker discussions, debates on ethical AI and panels exploring AI from creation to post-production, led by AI experts from Europe.

One company partnering with the Marché du Film is Tel Aviv- and LA-based Adapt Entertainment, that uses AI to present an alternative to subtiling and dubbing, offering the potential to increase a film's saleability on the international market.

Adapt's generative AI technology is designed to render video content multingual, employing "cutting-edge machine learning AI technology" to "maintain the intergrity of the original performance and direction" while adapting the work to a new language. The process doesn't attempt to match the lips of the actors, but "produce a new performance with the new language as if it had been originally filmed".

AI companies are also participating the in the Marché du Film's Next Tech on the Beach series of events, including: Reality Defender, a firm specialising in the detection of AI-generated fraud and misinformation; Quantic Brains, which offers AI tools for fast audiovisual and 3D animation production; and Deeptune, an AI-powered dubbing platform designed to make the process faster and more cost-effective. Saudi Arabia celebrates first home-grown title in Cannes Official Selection


The country also boasts New Cities, expanded financial support for the film industry. The Saudi Arabian film industry has come a long way in a short amount of time. s recently as 2017, the Saudis lifted a 35-year ban on cinema and began to simultaneously build a film industry. Less than a decade later, Saudi Arabia is celebrating its first

film in the Official Selection in Cannes with the home-grown film *Norah* from local director Tawfik Alzaidi.

Playing in this year's Un Certain Regard section, the film is set in 1990s Saudi Arabia when conservatism was at its height, and all forms of art and painting were banned. *Norah* premiered in December at Saudi Arabia's Red Sea Film Festival in Jeddah. It's not just overseas. Back home, its box office is growing. In 2023, box-office revenues increased 20%, year on year, making Saudi the 15th biggest box office in the world, with ticket sales hitting US\$240m. 443 films were released, with 17.4 million admissions. Local films are also doing well at the box office.

In 2023, *Sattar*, an action comedy set in the world of Saudi wrestling, grossed US\$10.8m in Saudi cinemas, making it then the eighth-highest-grossing movie of all time. It's also scenic. Driving overland two years ago to connect the dots between Saudi Arabia's fast-growing film industry and other locations in the Middle East, including Palestine, Jordan and Israel, I watched the filming of *Norah* in the sweltering desert in AlUla, whose fame is both ancient and even more recent than the lifting of the cinema ban.

AlUla, a remote desert outpost, famous for some ancient tombs at Hegra, and more recently brought into the future with



designer hotels and state-of-the-art filming facilities, made its own Cannes debut in 2021 when reps came to the festival to promote the region. Saudi Arabia first had a pavilion in Cannes in 2018.

On the way to AlUla, I passed the brand new city of Neom which was built from scratch in 2017, and is offering a futuristic alternative option to AlUla, hosting more and more shoots since its media village opened in 2022.

SAUDIWOOD IS BORN

All are the results of substantial and targeted investments from the Kingdom, designed to create and boost Saudi Arabia's film industry, economy and appeal to tourists. To this end, a number of film funds have also been launched. Most recently in February, MEFIC Capital launched a US\$100m Saudi Film Fund with 40% of its budget supplied by the Kingdom's Cultural Development Fund. The Saudi Film Fund's main goal is to elevate local productions to international standards and encourage international partnerships, it said. Also in February of this year, Saudi Arabia's General Entertainment Authority (GEA) launched the Big Time Investment fund co-sponsored by the Ministry of Culture to boost film production across the region. To follow are the investment funds Big Time 2 and Big Time 3 to support American and Indian features. The fund aims to produce 20 movies in the region in 2024. In 2023, the Saudi Film Commission launched Daw, an initiative to support local filmmakers. In 2021, the government launched a cash rebate scheme of 40% through Film Saudi. The Red Sea Fund was also launched in 2021 at the Red Sea Film Festival to support Arab and African filmmakers and directors, and 250 plus projects have been supported. Saudi Arabia has also been attracting international productions. This includes the Gerard Butler action-thriller Kandahar, which was filmed in AlUla and Anthony Mackie's Desert Warrior which filmed in Neom. Some of the crime drama Cherry was shot in AlUla and Riyadh. All three used the rebate scheme.

NEOM MEDIA INDUSTRIES A NEW HOME FOR THE GLOBAL FILM BUSINESS

NEOM Media Industries' journey began with the establishment of state-of-the-art production facilities, offering filmmakers top infrastructure, cutting-edge technology and versatile shooting locations to bring their creative visions to life.

As home to the region's largest operational state-of-the-art facilities, NEOM Media Industries is being touted as the go-to production destination in the Middle East and North Africa.

NEOM Media Village offers four industry-standard stages, equipped with key amenities including make-up rooms, green rooms, workshops and production offices. A 1,200 sq m virtual production stage has been added this year.

Sound stages are plentiful. The expansion of the Bajdah Studios site encompasses two sound stages, with an additional four currently under construction.

The backlot offering includes diverse standing sets while the studio can provide access to unique locations within a 30-minute radius. Comfort is guaranteed. NEOM provides resort-style lodgings for up to 350 cast and crew members, with plans to expand this capacity to over 750 by 2024. Additionally, NEOM features healthcare centres, leisure amenities, restaurants, and schools. NEOM Bay Airport offers direct flights to major hubs including London, Dubai and Doha, with more key locations being added this year.

Providers are now establishing their businesses at NEOM, including set builders, equipment rental providers and specialised vehicles — and more. Talent development and job creation are part of the plan and includes scholarships and vocational training programmes with partners including the National Film and Television School in the UK.

Currently running are 30 specialised pro-

grammes across the media spectrum. This growth has transformed NEOM into an operational unit leading the way in KSA in terms of applied technical and vocational learning. These programmes are paired with production placements and paid internships, facilitating the transition of graduates into full-time roles in the industry.

About 1,000 Saudis trained across various media disciplines. Growth remains the goal to ensure NEOM Media Industries builds a sustainable industry base.

Over the last two years, NEOM has facilitated the production of 40 projects spanning Hollywood, Bollywood, the Arab world and local Saudi features. They encompass a wide spectrum, including features, high-end scripted and unscripted TV series, documentaries and commercials. Its film production pipeline boasts 20 titles over the next three years, with several multi-picture deals already in progress with regional production houses. Saudi feature film Al Gaid, directed by Hussam Alhulwah, marked the first release in a nine-picture deal with studio Telfaz11, with the second feature currently in pre-production, and a five-production deal over two years with SBA further demonstrating the trust that industry leaders place in NEOM Media Industries' capabilities.

In television, it's journey has evolved from standalone shows and localised adaptations of international formats to establishing the region's premier international format hub, in collaboration with global leaders in non-scripted TV production. These formats bolster the production pipeline and instill confidence throughout the entire production value chain, showcasing tangible opportunities for businesses and talent alike, both now and in the foreseeable future.

FOCUS SAUDI ARABIA

O&A WITH

CHARLENE DELEON-JONES EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FILM ALULA

What is your presence in Cannes this year, both at the Festival and the market?

We are delighted that this year for the first time a Saudi film has been officially selected in competition at the 77th Cannes Film Festival. Filmed in AlUla and featuring an all-Saudi cast, Norah is directed by Tawfik Alzaidi and stars Yagoub Alfarhan, Maria Bahrawi, and Abdullah Alsadhan. We are thrilled to be celebrating and supporting the film in Cannes this year, which also had a crew of over 40% Saudi nationals so is a genuinely home-grown project. We are also celebrating a milestone with our successful AlUla Creates initiative. Last year, we announced the winning filmmakers Raneem and Dana Almohandes, Hana Alfasi and Maram Taibah who each shot their short films earlier this year in, and inspired by, AlUla supported by our mentors James Richardson and Jane Moore of the award-winning Vertigo films (Monsters, Britannia, Bronson) and Saudi director Haifaa Al Mansour (The Perfect Candidate, Wadjda). During the Festival we are hosting an exclusive footage presentation of the short films, providing a platform for the filmmakers to showcase their work to distributors, future production partners and press.

What have been the biggest hits from your territory at overseas festivals/markets? Tawfik Alzaidi's Norah is doing incredibly well on the international stage following its

premiere at the Red Sea International Film Festival in December 2023 where it won the Best Saudi Film Award. The film continues to garner acclaim, symbolising a significant moment for the burgeoning Saudi film industry globally, and is now being recognised in Cannes and has been officially selected for the Un Certain Regard section of the Festival. The film tells the poignant story of an orphaned voung woman with a deep yearning for self-expression.

What has happened in broad strokes in the past year?

Film AlUla celebrated a milestone year in 2023, securing a landmark partnership with Stampede Ventures — with the Hollywood independent now bringing 10 productions to the region over three years, with a projected US\$350m spend. This marks the biggest deal of its kind since the lifting of the cinema ban in Saudi Arabia. In 2023, 123 projects were shot in AlUla, ranging from feature-length films, scripted and reality series to commercials, documentaries and music videos. These ranged across a breadth of genres and formats that the landscapes and facilities offer. During 2023 we welcomed season three of Paper Empire starring Denise Richards and Kelsey Grammer, internationally renowned DJ David Guetta for his music video The Monolith at AlUla and Netflix reality series Dubai Bling. Earlier this year, we hosted Saudi/Turkish feature film Siwar and another Netflix reality series, Soy Georgina. Film AlUla



also launched its brand-new studio complex, including two 26,000 sq ft soundstages, alongside a production building housing hair and make-up rooms wardrobe facilities offices, board rooms and dressing rooms. The complex includes 15,400 sq ft workshops for each stage, RV parking areas, an administration building, sound recording studio, kitchen and events space, as well as a 61,500 sq ft backlot for additional temporary infrastructure and set builds. We have also begun the next stage of expansion, which will see a state-of-the-art recording studio open soon.

Incentives, news?

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Film AlUla is continuing to enable productions to optimise the 40% cash-rebate programme and incentives in Saudi Arabia. We have assembled a team of experts on the ground for support in all areas of production, from development to delivery. The team can also guide productions through securing

the rebate, navigating production regulations, custom clearances, visa applications and filming permits, alongside location scouting and talent recruitment.

Which bodies support local and overseas filmmakers?

Film AlUla's primary mission is to build a sustainable film ecosystem, opening up opportunities for the next generation of filmmakers who may have never considered a career in film production. We have introduced a number of initiatives to provide upskilling opportunities for people in AlUla and across Saudi Arabia, alongside working with regional film and arts institutions and schools. We also launched initiatives in support of the growing film-friendly ecosystem, ensuring a growing pool of local expertise to offer productions. In 2023, we partnered with the UK's Creative Media Skills Institute to host a 10-day bootcamp led by award-winning film professionals who passed on knowledge and expertise to a new generation of local filmmakers. Last year also saw the launch of AlUla Creates, a year-round platform designed to nurture creativity and empower future generations in film, the arts and fashion. We have a number of training initiatives with international partners and a thriving co-educational programme with our production partners including Stampede Ventures. Through these partnerships we are supporting not only the next generation of filmmakers but recognising the importance of developing the skills for below the line production support.

WIPO honour, the Marché du Film is hosting the Swiss Hub, a new dedicated space in the Palais des Festivals. Here, attendees can explore and try out the latest cutting-edge tools and technologies — for example robo-dogs, spatial tools and interactive installations — from Swiss start-ups. The Swiss Hub is also the place to meet Swiss producers during the market. A showcase for all the Swiss producer associations, the Hub offers potential co-producers from all over the world information about working with Switzerland as a co-production partner.

And market attendees can also learn about the Swiss film industry and its co-production incentives at the Swiss Pavilion at the Village International.

Organised by the promotion agency Swiss Films and in collaboration with the Swiss Federal Office of Culture and the Swiss Broadcasting Corporation, SRG SSR, Switzerland's participation in Cannes aims to showcase the country's many contributions to the global film industry.

A series of conferences is being led by notable industry speakers from a number of Swiss institutions, including the Locarno Film Festival, Cinémathèque Suisse, ProHelvetia (Swiss Arts Council) and the Zurich Film Festival. And The European Film Academy is holding a session to promote the upcoming European Film Awards Ceremony in Lucerne in December 2024.

In addition to these conferences, Swiss Films is presenting a series of sessions that highlight Switzerland's most promising projects and talents across the Marché du Film's key industry programmes, including:

The Producers Network, designed to boost networking and co-production opportunities, will introduce five promising Swiss producers and their latest works at the Producers Club, on May 17 at 09.00.

Cannes Docs, the dedicated platform for documentary professionals, is showcasing four Swiss docs-in-progress presented by Visions du Réel Nyon, on May 19 in the Lérins 4 Screening Room at 11:45.

Goes to Cannes is showcasing five fiction worksin-progress from Swiss talents, presented by Solothurn Film Festival — with the aim of connecting the projects with potential sales agents, distributors and festival programmers — on May 18, in Auditorium K at 12:00.

Cannes Next is hosting a new edition of Producers Pitching Their Projects on May 16 on the Main Stage at 14.00, supported by research and data company Largo.AI. During the session 15 producers pitch their films in a three-minute format. Cannes Next is also hosting a panel that explores the The Future of Storytelling by looking at the production and distribution of immersive works from a variety of perspectives — on May 16 in the Press Conference Room of the Palais des Festivals, at 15.00.

And Festivals Hub, an initiative designed to propose activities for global film festivals and markets, is hosting the panel Swiss Film Fest Focus: Exploring Diversity & Collaboration, featuring the artistic directors from Switzerland's leading film festivals including the Locarno Film Festival, Visions du Réel Nyon, the Zurich Film Festival, the Neuchâtel International Fantastic Film Festival and the Geneva International Film Festival — on May 18 at the The Viewpoint, at 15:00.

In Official Selection this year, two Swiss entries are premiering in Un Certain Regard: *The Shameless* by Konstantin Bojanov and *Dog on Trial (Le procès du chien)* by Laetitia Dosch. And Claude Barras' stop-motion animation *Savages!* debuts as a Special Screening within the Official Selection. Additionally, Elena López Riera's Swiss short *Las Novias del Sur* is screening in the Short Film Selection of the Semaine de la Critique, also in the Special Screenings category.


